## Internet Permission Slip

Skilled research and reporting are essential components of curricular education. MLCS teachers instruct their students in appropriate research strategies when exploring information in books, magazines, encyclopedias, and a variety of online information. Note taking from multiple resources, footnoting, bibliographies, and summarizing information in a student's own words are critical research and report skills. Therefore, it is unacceptable for a student to visit one website, download the information, and use this as sole resource for a research assignment. While the purpose of providing internet access is educational, students *may* abuse the privilege and access unacceptable sites.

Requirements for internet use at Mother Lode Christian School:

- Students will be permitted to access sites *selected* and/or *bookmarked* by their teacher.
- Students are not permitted to enter a URL address.
- Recreational games of any kind are not permitted on MLCS computers.
- Students are not to enter, access, participate in or read from chat rooms, Facebook or message boards.
- Students are not allowed to download freeware, shareware or any other programs without the express permission of the MLCS staff person in charge of the computer lab/classroom computers.
- Students shall not access radio broadcasting or streaming music files and shall not play music or music CDs, DVDs or other recorded music on computer lab/classroom equipment or in the computer lab.
- Students shall not access or enter personal web pages or sites which promote personal web page development; such as Instagram, YouTube or Facebook.

Ultimately, parents and guardians of MLCS students are responsible for media and internet standards for their children. We expect our students to use school computers responsibly. The use of Mother Lode Christian School's computer system and internet access is a privilege, not a right. Consequences for violating any of the above requirements may result in the following:

- a. Loss of MLCS Internet privileges for a period of time to be determined by the principal.
- b. Parent and student conferences with the administration and Board.
- c. Suspension /expulsion from school.

Google provides information about the information it collects, as well as how it uses and discloses the information it collects from G Suite for Education accounts in its G Suite for Education Privacy Notice. ## **What personal information does Google collect?**

When creating a student account, Mother Lode Christian School may provide Google with certain personal information about the student, including, for example, a name, email address, and password. Google may also collect personal information directly from students, such as telephone number for account recovery or a profile photo added to the G Suite for Education account.

When a student uses Google services, Google also collects information based on the use of those services. This includes:

- device information, such as the hardware model, operating system version, unique device identifiers, and mobile network information including phone number;
- log information, including details of how a user used Google services, device event information, and the user's Internet protocol (IP) address;
- location information, as determined by various technologies including IP address, GPS, and other sensors;
- unique application numbers, such as application version number; and
- cookies or similar technologies which are used to collect and store information about a browser or device, such as preferred language and other settings.

## **How does Google use this information?**

In G Suite for Education Core Services, Google uses student personal information to provide, maintain, and protect the services. Google does not serve ads in the Core Services or use personal information collected in the Core Services for advertising purposes.

Google will not share personal information with companies, organizations and individuals outside of Google unless one of the following circumstances applies:

- With parental or guardian consent. Google will share personal information with companies, organizations or individuals outside of Google when it has parents' consent (for users below the age of consent), which may be obtained through G Suite for Education schools.
- With [insert name of school/district]. G Suite for Education accounts, because they are school-managed accounts, give administrators access to information stored in them.
- For external processing. Google may provide personal information to affiliates or other trusted businesses or persons to process it for Google, based on Google's instructions and in compliance with the G Suite for Education privacy notice and any other appropriate confidentiality and security measures.
- For legal reasons. Google will share personal information with companies, organizations or individuals outside of Google if it has a good-faith belief that access, use, preservation or disclosure of the information is reasonably necessary to:
  - meet any applicable law, regulation, legal process or enforceable governmental request.
  - enforce applicable Terms of Service, including investigation of potential violations.
  - detect, prevent, or otherwise address fraud, security or technical issues.
  - protect against harm to the rights, property or safety of Google, Google users or the public as required or permitted by law.

Google also shares non-personal information -- such as trends about the use of its services -- publicly and with its partners.

## What choices do I have as a parent or guardian?

First, you can consent to the collection and use of your child's information by Google. If you don't provide your consent, we will not create a G Suite for Education account for your child, and Google will not collect or use your child's information as described in this notice.

If you consent to your child's use of G Suite for Education, you can access or request deletion of your child's G Suite for Education account by contacting [insert contact information for school administrator]. If you wish to stop any further collection or use of your child's information, you can request that we use the service controls available to limit your child's access to features or services, or delete your child's account entirely.
